1. Read John 1:14-17
Who was full of grace and brought the grace of God to men?
2. Read James 4:6 and Philippians 2:1-12 and see why Jesus received grace from God.
3. Read Ephesians 2:1-10 and Genesis 6, 7 & 8
Was Noah's salvation a gift of God? Why do you think so.
Can you see how grace was the means of salvation for Noah?
What was Noah saved from? What does the ark represent when we see the way God has saved us. Read Colossians 1:20-22 for a clue.
What was necessary from Noah for him to be saved?
Read Hebrews 11:7 for another essential for Noah.
Can you see something else from Romans 10:1-3 about what we must do to be saved?
What was Noah's response after they returned to land again?
Should that be our response to God?
4. Read 1 Timothy 1:12-17 to see how Paul described the grace he was shown.
Did the grace depend on Paul?
When God shows grace does He show mercy too?
What is Paul's response to the grace shown him?
Did he want to tell others about what Jesus had done for him? Read Acts 9:20
5. Read Romans 3:20-26 and Romans 4:1-5 & 16
Was the grace shown to Abraham according to his own works?
Was faith essential?
Is that why we must receive ours by faith?
Can anyone be saved by their own works?
6. Read Romans 6:1
Should we?
7. Read Ephesians 4:7 and John 1:16
Is there any difference in the grace anyone receives from God?
8. Read Acts 13:43
Should we continue in the grace of God in our lives or now go back to our own works once we are saved?
Read Galatians 2:20-21, Galatians 1:6, 2 Corinthians 12:9
9. Read Hebrews 4:14-16
Where do we go to for the grace to continue in our lives?
Read Acts 4:23-33 and see how God answered their prayer for help and what was on them (vs. 33)
Was the grace on just a few or on all?
Should we expect the same today in our fellowship with everyone experiencing great grace?
